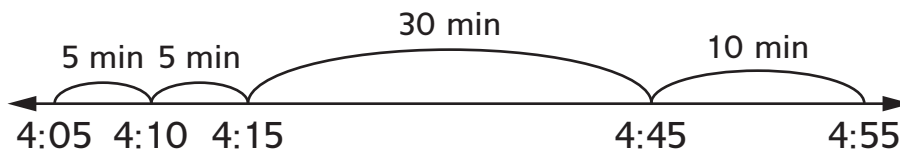

**Example:** Ann starts swim practice at 4:05 P.M. and finishes at 4:55 P.M.



How long is Ann's swim practice? Use the open number line to help.
